- Mae **anogaeth yn bwysicach** nag unrhyw beth. Eisteddwch gyda'ch plentyn a siaradwch am y tasgau dan sylw. Fe fyddwch yn synnu pa mor dda mae'ch plentyn yn gallu egluro'r dasg i chi gyda'i eiriau ei hun.
- Os nad ydych yn gyfarwydd â'r termau, **gofynnwch i'ch plentyn esbonio**. Wrth fynd drwy'r broses o egluro, fe fyddant yn dod i ddeall yn well eu hunain.
- Ewch i'r **nosweithiau rhieni** i gael gwybodaeth. Gofynnwch oes canllaw adolygu neu adnoddau eraill ar gael i roi cymorth gyda gwaith cartref.
- Mae cyfieithiad o holl dermau addysg y plant ar gael yr y **Geiriadur 'Termau' ar lein neu'r Ap Geiriaduron** ar eich ffôn .
- Dangoswch ddiddordeb yng ngwaith ysgol eich plentyn. Os oes angen cymorth arnynt, anogwch nhw i ofyn am help oddi wrth yr **athrawon**.
- Os ydych chi'n poeni am unrhyw beth, cysylltwch â'r ysgol a siaradwch â'r athro - **byddant eisiau helpu**.

# Gwaith Cartref yn yr Uwchradd

1. Gofynnwch i'ch plentyn egluro'r dasg i chi yn Saesneg neu yn Gymraeg. Gwiriwch unrhyw eirfa neu dermau anodd gyda'ch qilydd os oes angen gan ddefnyddio geiriaduron ar-lein neu'r **Ap Geiriaduron**.
2. Trafodwch y gwaith yn **Gymraeg** neu'n **Saesneg**. Peidiwch poeni os ydych chi'n gorfol defnyddio geiriau technegol yn Saesneg wrth drafod.
3. **Peidiwch poeni** os ydych plentyn yn cywiro eich Cymraeg. Bydd hyn yn magu eu hyder ieithyddol nhw.
4. Anogwch eich plentyn i wirio ei atebion drwy ddefnyddio **Cysill ar-lein**.
5. Awgrymwch i'ch plentyn lawrlwytho'r ap yma ar ei ffôn Android, iPad neu iPhone am ddim. Fe fydd yn rhoi'r eirfa gywir yn Saesneg ac yn Gymraeg iddo ar flaenau ei fysedd.

# Welsh Homework?

## No problem



You don't have to be Welsh speaking for your child to thrive in Welsh Medium education.



## Will I be able to help with my child's Welsh Homework?

- Homework is usually an **extension of classwork** so your child will have a good idea of what is expected.
- It is important to remember it's your **child's homework** and not yours! You shouldn't do the homework for them.
- You may not be a musician but you encourage your child to learn to play a musical instrument. You can't **practise the piano** for them.
- You may not like football but you **support** them from the side lines.

**The most important thing is to be positive and to give  
praise and encouragement!**

## Ideas on how to help with Homework - 'Gwaith Cartref'

- **Encouragement is most important.** Sit with your child and talk about the tasks in English. You will be surprised how good your child will be at explaining the task to you.
- Ask your child to **explain the work first.** As they explain, they will go through the problem step by step. This helps them to get to grips with what they need to do.
- Attend **parents' evenings** to gain information. Find out if there is a revision guide or other resources that can provide support with homework.
- Some schools have **homework clubs.**
- Show an interest in your child's school work. If they need help then encourage them to seek out the **teacher.**
- If you are worried about anything, contact the school and talk to the teacher.  
**They will want to help.**
- Ensure that you **ask your child** regularly whether they have been set homework so that it becomes routine.

The most important thing is to be **supportive** so as to build your child's **confidence.**

# Talk is the Key to Learning to Read

How about...

- Naming objects around the house, on the street, in the shops and when traveling by car or bus;
- Looking at Welsh signs when out shopping or going to the Swimming pool or Leisure Centre;
- Reading story books together - there are many bilingual books available;
- Showing pictures and naming objects;
- Learning simple rhymes and songs while listening to apps/online or listen to stories on Welsh Apps;
- Having cuddles and reading on the sofa. Learn a little Welsh yourself and practice with your child every day;

**Don't worry about being perfect! Give it a try!**

- Watching Welsh television programs together like CYW and Stwnsh on S4C. ([S4C.co.uk/cyw](http://S4C.co.uk/cyw))
- Visit Welsh bookshops or visit your local library for some Welsh books, DVDs and games.

**Remember – children learn to switch from one language to another much more easily than adults.**

# Homework in Secondary School

Quote from a year 7 pupil...

**"Parents CAN help with homework.  
Just talk to them in English about what  
you're doing, and then write it in Welsh!"**

As young people mature, they may not want much help from parents but you can still show interest in their work even when the work becomes more specialised.

1. Ask the child to **explain** the task to you in English. Check any difficult vocabulary to make sure you understand each other properly.
2. Discuss the work in **English**.
3. Encourage the child to **translate** what was discussed back into Welsh. You can assist if needed using an online lexicon.
4. Encourage your child to check their answers using **Cysill online**.
