

**THE COUNTY OF CARMARTHENSHIRE (AMMENDMENT)
PROHIBITION OF STOPPING ORDER 2010**

The Carmarthenshire County Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Section 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and 4(3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") as amended by Schedule 8 of the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1. No person shall cause any vehicle to stop between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 9.00 a.m. and 3.00 p.m. and 4.00 p.m. on any day except Saturday and Sunday in that length of the road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
2. This Order shall come into operation on the 19th day of November, 2010 and may be cited as "The County of Carmarthenshire (Amendment) (Prohibition of Stopping) Order 2010"

From a point 87 metres east of its junction with the TRA483 Pen y Benc Road, for a distance of 57 metres in an easterly direction

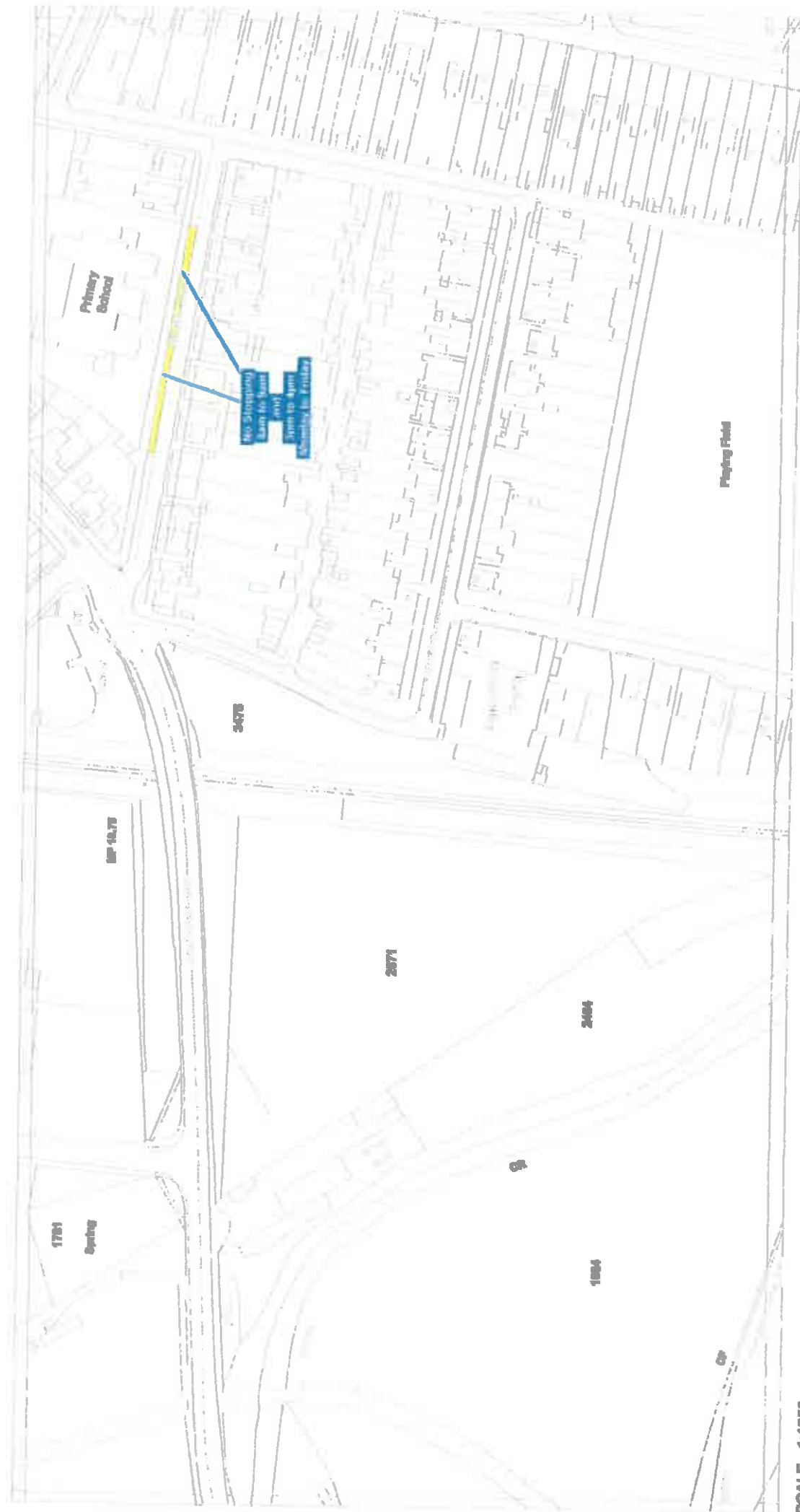
